



PTFF-17 – “Caviar”

Caviar refers to the roe (internal eggs) obtained from the wild sturgeon fish found in the Caspian and Black Seas. The rarest and costliest is the Beluga from the Caspian Sea. Caviar is marketed worldwide as a delicacy and prices can exceed \$16,000 per Kg. Major producers include Iran, Azerbaijan and Kazakhstan.

The product is extremely perishable and must be kept refrigerated until consumption.

Suggested Aircraft:

Appropriate freight aircraft. Loads are unlikely to exceed a few tonnes.

Flight Schedule:

1. Load refrigerated containers of caviar at FS9 – Bina/FSX - Heydar Aliyev, Baku, Azerbaijan (UBBB) and fly to Paris, France (LFPG) – 2,050nm.
2. Load refrigerated containers of Caviar at Atyrau, Kazakhstan (UATG) and deliver at El Prat, Barcelona, Spain (LEBL) – 2,131nm.
