



PTFF-79 – “Supply of UN bases – South Sudan”

The Republic of South Sudan became an independent state in July 2011 and is also a UN Member State. Post-independence, South Sudan remains at war with anti-government militia in seven of its ten provinces. In response, the UN Security Council established UNMISS, an operation to consolidate peace and security. UNMISS has set up bases for UN troops and civilian refugees. These sites require a constant supply of food, water and military supplies.



Republic of South Sudan - Provinces

Suggested Aircraft:

C-5, C-17, C-130, B747F, STOL aircraft eg, Antonov AN24, Dornier328, BN2

Flight Schedule:

C-5, C-17, B747F, C-130

1. Load supplies at Jazan (OEGN). Deliver to Juba (HSSJ) - 970nm.
2. Load supplies at King Khalid AB (OEKM). Deliver to Wau (HSWW) – 1,070nm.

STOL aircraft.

3. Load supplies at Juba (HSSJ) and deliver to Maridi (HSMD). Return to Juba - 254nm.
4. Load supplies at Juba (HSSJ). Deliver to Pibor (HSPI). Return to Juba - 290 nm.
5. Load Supplies at Wau (HSWW) and deliver to Yirol (HSYL). Return to Wau - 330nm.
